Tell me about the NecroVomits. Who all is in the band? How long have you been making music together?

Jay: I play guitar, synth, and program drums.

Laurel: We just started. I do vocals and I also recently started playing the theramin so we're gonna add that in.

Jay: In October last year we wrote and recorded our first EP called Ghoulish Grotesqueries. It came out on Vinyl and CD through a Mexican label called Sotser Grinder Records. Hoping to do a cassette version sometime either on Sotser or another label.

How would you describe your sound to a new potential listener? What is the song to get someone hooked?

Laurel: Electrified, dusty, cadavers in an abandoned cathedral. Stuff like that, and then the church is on top of a burial ground and smells like wet soil. That's what I think of imagery-wise.

Jay: I'd describe our music as thrash but if I had to put imagery to it like Laurel did I guess I think of skeletons with spikey white hair and black studded jackets. I don't know. I've heard someone call it thrash or speed but with death and black metal vocals. Not sure if that's accurate. Honestly, I just write riffs and it sounds like whatever comes out. I like the raw, grimy low-end that a worn out cassette kinda has, and buzzsaw guitars, and I look up to bands like Broken Bones and English Dogs.

Laurel: I don't know what song. I guess I would say Congratulations, You're Cheese. **Jay:** Congrats You're Cheese is a good one but I think the song that defines us the most is our song Hooked On Video. Please just spin our EP in its entirety.

Do you have any upcoming shows or projects you'd like to talk about? (Aug/Sep)

Laurel: We don't have any shows coming up. We're currently writing new material.

Jay: I wanna start making some music videos, record and release a full length, and tour.

A lot coming up but I had a hand injury that set us back a little bit.

What's on your playlist these days? What have you been listening too lately?

Jay: We've been spinning all kinds of things. I'm always listening to Coup D'Etat, the Plasmatics LP. Lately I've also been listening to Hallow's Eve. I love that song Lethal Tendencies on the River's Edge soundtrack and it's also in a scene in Pacific Heights. Laurel: I've been listening to a variety of stuff. Recently, I started listening to Qual. That's a constant I can think of at the moment. Other than that, I guess a variety of things. I can go from something like Cripple Bastards to some freestyle like Johnny O. Just depends where I'm at.
